


<u>We also looked at</u>:

Love is at the heart of Life





Introduction to God's Life **1. Prosperity Gospel** "Your Best Life Now"

- Pastor Greg Gilbert: "It was Benjamin Franklin, not Jesus, who said, "God helps those who help themselves." That is Osteen's message, too, only it is more like 'God helps those who think well of themselves.'
- Osteen: "God didn't make you to be average. God created you to excel...if you will start acting like it, talking like it, seeing yourself as more than a conqueror, you will live a prosperous and victorious life."

Introduction to God's Life 1. Prosperity Gospel

- <u>Gilbert</u>: "Osteen's God is little more than the mechanism that gives the power to positive thinking. There is <u>no cross</u>. There is <u>no sin</u>. There is <u>no redemption</u> or <u>salvation</u> or <u>eternity</u>."
- "The really frightening thing is that 8 million people have bought 'Your Best Life Now', and a good portion of those have probably walked away thinking they have read the Christian gospel.
 They think they understand the message of the Bible, and it is <u>me</u>. <u>My success. My self-esteem. My house. My car. My promotion</u>."





<u>Introduction to God's Life</u> 2. Second Baptism <u>R.C. Sproul</u>:

"More books about the Holy Spirit have been written since the mid-twentieth century than were written in all the years of church history before then combined.

Much of this is due to the Pentecostal and charismatic movements, with their emphases on the baptism of the Holy Spirit and "sign gifts" such as tongues.

Introduction to God's Life 2. Second Baptism

These traditions tend to distinguish between *Spirit-filled* Christians and non-Spirit-filled Christians. Anyone who trusts in Jesus for salvation is a non-Spirit-filled Christian, while Spirit-filled Christians have experienced a second work of grace known as the baptism of the Holy Spirit an infilling of God's Spirit with power and gifts for ministry. Normally, Pentecostals believe speaking in tongues proves that one has received the Holy Spirit.

Introduction to God's Life 2. Second Baptism

When we separate the baptism of the Holy Spirit from conversion, we end up with second-class citizens in the kingdom of God. But as the Lord has poured out His Spirit on all His people, this is impossible. Christians may be at different points in their sanctification and level of Christian maturity, but <u>no Christian lacks the Holy Spirit in his life</u>".

<u>Introduction to God's Life</u> 2. Second Baptism <u>1 Cor 12.12-13</u>

For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ.

For in one Spirit we were all baptized into one body — Jews or Greeks, slaves or free — and all were made to drink of one Spirit.

I came that they may have life and have it <u>abundantly</u>. (John 10.10) The desire to <u>live abundantly</u> is not evil.

But you will never find it by looking to *prosper yourself* or by trying to supercharge your Christianity through a <u>second baptism</u>.

Perhaps you're thinking, "I'm not a fan of Joel Osteen or of the belief that I need a second baptism." ...but do you have <u>your own version</u> of "Meism"? Do you feel like *God is obligated* to meet your needs because of your commitment to Him? Is He your *personal genie*? - that if you rub the lamp of your life just right, He will grant you your wishes? (UCLA) Pop Quiz: <u>What happens when your cup gets bumped</u>?

1 Corinthians 6.19b-20a

You are <u>not your own</u>, for you were bought with a price.

Galatians 2.20

And now, what does it all matter? It matters more than anything else in the world. The whole dance, or drama, or pattern of this three-Personal life is to be played out in each one of us... or (putting it the other way round) <u>each one of us has got to</u> <u>enter that pattern</u>, take his place in that dance. There is no other way to the happiness for which we were made.

Good things as well as bad, you know, are caught by a kind of infection, if you want to get warm you must stand near the fire: if you want to be wet you must get into the water. If you want joy, power, peace, eternal life, you must get close to, or even into, the thing that has them. They are not a sort of prize which God could, if He chose, just hand out to anyone.
