Most important part of any relationship:

Communication

Let's say there's a <u>conflict</u> between two people and you have this strong desire to explain how the other person has hurt you.

But the other person has the exact same desire: to express how you have hurt her...

And now there's <u>conflict</u> about how to <u>resolve</u> the <u>conflict</u>...

Sound familiar?

Both are thinking:

"If you could just see things from my point of view!"

# A Good Communicator:

The ability to get you to see life from <a href="my-point of view">my-point of view</a>...

or

The ability to humbly see life from your point of view.

Strong Relationship: each person has a stronger desire to <u>listen</u> than to <u>convince</u>

Weaker Relationship: each person has a stronger desire to convince than to listen

## Matthew 6.5

And when you pray, you must not be like the hypocrites. For they love to stand and pray in the synagogues and at the street corners, that they may be seen by others. Truly, I say to you, they have received their reward.

### Matthew 6.6

But when you pray, go into your room and shut the door and pray to your <u>Father</u> who is in secret. And your <u>Father</u> who sees in secret will reward you.

## Luke 18.9-14

# Communication

Should we spend all our time talking? Is prayer meant to be monologue or dialogue?

Prayer is designed to get our eyes off ourselves and see life from God's point of view...

Since prayer is all about communication, we need to be better at

listening

rather than just talking.

### Mark 9.1-7

## Alignment

When we pray, we must start with our Father and then...

Meditate on what that means — spend plenty of time listening

Adore God – for who He is and what He has done

Confess and forsake sin – reflection: the sin behind the sin

Thankfulness — "good, bad and ugly"

<u>Supplication</u> — is it: "not your will, but mine, be done"?

### Luke 22.39-44

And he came out and went, as was his custom, to the Mount of Olives, and the disciples followed him. And when he came to the place, he said to them, "Pray that you may not enter into temptation." And he withdrew from them about a stone's throw, and knelt down and prayed, saying,

### When I Don't Desire God

~John Piper~ (p.165)

This is the central method of prayer that I believe most earnest Christians have discovered: "to meditate on the word of God...turning all, as I go, into prayer."

Someone may ask, "How can I spend an hour in prayer? I'm done asking for what I need in <u>five or ten minutes</u>."

### When I Don't Desire God

~John Piper~ (p.165)

I answer: Take a passage of Scripture, and start reading it slowly. After each sentence, pause and go back and turn what you read into prayer.

In this way, you can pray as long as you read. You may pray all day.
