God's Role and Our Role in the Pursuit of Holiness



Any moment in our lives when we bask in God's <u>mercy and grace</u> is our highest moment. Higher than when we feel snug in our decent performance and cannot think of anything we need to confess. (p. 26-27)

This is the message we have heard from him and proclaim to you, that <u>God is light, and in him is no</u> <u>darkness at all</u>. If we say we have fellowship with him while we walk in darkness, we lie and do not practice the truth.

But if we <u>walk in the light</u>, as he is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus his Son cleanses us from all sin.

Second simple (but not easy) question:

Since we know our hearts are sick and broken...

how can we seek God with ALL of it?

Second simple (but not easy) answer:

My heart has been penetrated by light. God's Light <u>has</u> and <u>will continue</u> to overwhelm the darkness... <u>aka...GRACE</u>

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<u>What do we normally do instead</u>? Believe the lie that God is ok with a heart that is partially His. (Immediately, Completely, Sweetly)

The <u>vision</u> and fruition of God will be so intimate and clear as to <u>transform</u> the soul into the likeness of God:

"We shall be like him, for we shall see him as he is," says the Apostle (1 John 3.2).



We look more and more <u>like</u> what we look <u>at</u>.





While you may be familiar with the old saying, "opposites attract," in reality, what the heart wants is someone who resembles its owner – and that resemblance increases the longer two lovebirds stay together.

University of Michigan psychologist Robert Zajonc conducted an experiment to test this phenomenon. He analyzed photographs of couples taken when they were newlyweds and photographs of the same couples taken 25 years later.

The results showed that the couples had grown to look more like each other over time. And, the happier that the couple said they were, the more likely they were to have increased in their physical similarity.

Zajonc suggested that older couples looked more alike because people in close contact mimic each other's <u>facial expressions</u>.

In other words, if your [spouse] has a good sense of humor and laughs a lot, he or she will probably develop laugh lines around their mouth — and so will you.

I HAVE SPENT a good part of my life talking with people about the role of faith in the face of imminent death. Since I became an ordained Presbyterian minister in 1975, I have sat at countless bedsides, and occasionally even watched someone take their final breath. But when, a little more than a month after that book was published, I was diagnosed with pancreatic cancer, I was still caught unprepared.
