Cancer

- Development of abnormal cells
- Divide uncontrollably
- > Ability to infiltrate and destroy normal body tissue
- > Ability to spread throughout your body
- ➤ 2nd leading cause of death in the United States
- > Internal disease that often goes undetected
- Screenings become vital for early treatment

Screening

- Mammogram (breast cancer)
- Colonoscopy (colon cancer)
- Pap Smear (cervical cancer)
- Dermatology Exam (skin cancer)
- > CT Scan, MRI (lung cancer)
- ► Blood Tests (kidney, liver, prostate cancer)
- ➤ Biopsy of Lymph Nodes (leukemia blood cancer)

Spiritual Screening

What happened?


- He/she doesn't even try to complete me anymore.


How is Self-centeredness like cancer?

 - Deadly



If you view your sinfulness as a bothersome headache more than a lethal cancer, you will see tepid growth, if any.



It's like we have a disease, one symptom of which is that we feel healthy. This is why the Bible often speaks of our sinfulness as blindness.

The ultimate outcome of self-centeredness in marriage?

Divorce

No one ever wakes up one morning and decides to file for divorce.

Just like cancer, there are <u>stages</u>.

James 1.14-15

But each person is tempted when he is lured and enticed by his own desire.

Then desire when it has conceived gives birth to sin, and sin when it is fully grown brings forth death.

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Then <u>desire</u> when it has <u>conceived</u> gives birth to <u>sin</u>, and <u>sin</u> when it is <u>fully grown</u> brings forth <u>death</u>.

Cancer Treatment?

- 1. Dealing with our self-centeredness

Our Self-centeredness keeps us from realizing that

just as much as we are wounded.

Self-centeredness in Marriage

Tim Keller:



She grew up a wounded person.

They are usually enormously self-centered.

You don't challenge them at all.

Self-centeredness has been aggravated by their mistreatment.

They have to do something about it.

1. You begin to see how selfish they really are.

2. They begin to tell you about how selfish they think you are.

3. Your own selfishness is not nearly as bad as the other person.

Emotional distance begins to develop.

Determine your selfishness is more serious than the other person's selfishness.

Two people that see my self-centeredness is the main problem in this marriage.

Is there any <u>hope?</u>
Is there any <u>help?</u>








Rich Wounds

We might expect that the Father would choose to remove the scars from his Son's eternal glorified flesh, but scars were God's idea to begin with.



That Luke and John testify so plainly to Jesus' resurrection scars must mean they are not a defect but a glory.

John 20.27

Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here, and see my hands; and put out your hand, and place it in my side. Do not disbelieve, but believe."

Our wounds are healed when we by faith reach out and touch His healed wounds.

What does all this have to do with Marriage?

- 1. In our marriages, we need to see our wounding and scarring as greater than being wounded and scarred by our spouse.
- 2. And to see this, we must see the Wounds and Scars that we inflicted on Jesus and be overwhelmed by His Love and passion to heal our scars with His.

Hurt people hurt people.
