But wounded people are hurting.



HOW TO BUILD DEEP FRIENDSHIPS & MARRIAGES UNDER GOD

In one song, the lyricist complains that he keeps "falling in and out of love" with different women.

Spiritual loved-based relationships are free from this problem.

Because spiritual love is a voluntary or willful <u>commitment to give</u>, it's not subject to momentary feelings.

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HOW TO BUILD DEEP FRIENDSHIPS & MARRIAGES UNDER GOD

That's why you cannot "fall out" of spiritual love as if it was beyond your control. Neither do you "fall in" spiritual love. Instead, you have to *build into* a spiritual love relationship. In our culture, falling in (eros) love is certainly the main, if not the only, criteria for marriage choices.

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HOW TO BUILD DEEP FRIENDSHIPS & MARRIAGES UNDER GOD Using this criterion, a couple can justify even the most hazardous marriage plans with the plea, "But, were in love!"

The concept is so ingrained in modern culture that even long-time Christians find themselves asking, "<u>How do I know when it's really love?</u>"

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HOW TO BUILD DEEP FRIENDSHIPS & MARRIAGES UNDER GOD

That question shows that they believe in a romantic attraction so strong that nothing can change it. They think the key to success is making sure they find "true" love – eros love so true it will never fade. Once married, they are shocked when the love dissipates.

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HOW TO BUILD DEEP FRIENDSHIPS & MARRIAGES UNDER GOD

When this happens, today's social norm is to admit they made a mistake, get a divorce, and try again. Unfortunately, one could safely predict that the same cycle will repeat itself – until they change their minds about what kind of love is foundational to marriage.

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HOW TO BUILD DEEP FRIENDSHIPS & MARRIAGES UNDER GOD Today, many young Christians are engaging in a pointless search for "real" love, instead of developing the <u>basic relational skills</u> they will need in marriage.

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HOW TO BUILD DEEP FRIENDSHIPS & MARRIAGES UNDER GOD

Others, already in a struggling marriage, are wasting time looking for lost eros feelings, or even becoming involved in extramarital affairs instead of setting about the task of <u>learning to love</u> <u>as Jesus loved us</u>.





How can God love someone with a heart like mine?

Do you feel like your marriage to God and to your spouse is defined by <u>poor decisions</u>? 4. <u>Is your heart tossed about</u>? Do you feel like your marriage to God and to your spouse is thrown up and down like a <u>storm at sea</u>?

We must be so careful <u>not to simplify</u> God's Love into what seems like love to us. (*positive circumstances*)

God's Love will often make us <u>uncomfortable</u>.

God's Love should cause us to <u>consider</u>, to <u>wonder</u>, to be <u>shocked</u>, <u>amazed</u>, and inspire a <u>longing to go deeper</u>.

Until you're <u>troubled</u> by it, until you're <u>perplexed</u> by it, you will never be <u>changed</u> by it.

Whose bars are these? Whose gates are these? Whose chains are these?



He cuts through His own bars!



If He was just a friend, He never would have put them in.

Until you see the <u>contradiction</u>, until you see the impossibility, you will never be <u>amazed at His Love</u>.
